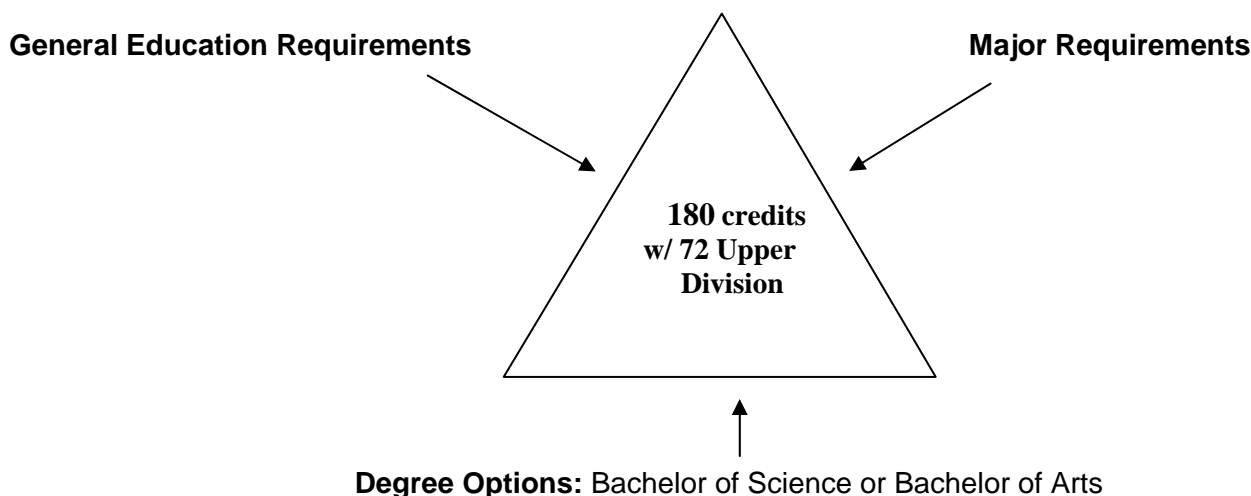


## Portland State University: Graduation Requirements ~Transfer Students



### Bachelor of Arts (BA) or Bachelor of Science (BS)

#### **Bachelor of Arts (BA) requirements:** 28 credits

- 12 credits in Arts/Letters (4 credits must be in Fine & Performing Arts\*),
- 12 credits in Sciences/Social Sciences (4 credits must be in Science, may include Math/Statistics), and
- 4 credits in foreign language numbered 203 or higher (conducted in the target language)

#### **Bachelor of Science (BS) requirements:** 28 credits

- 12 credits in Sciences (excludes Math/Stats)
  - 8 of the 12 Science credits must include a lab or field work
- 12 credits in Arts/Letters and/or Social Sciences
- 4 credits in Math/Stat 105 or higher

### General Education Requirements

#### **Junior Cluster: 12 credits** (*choose one theme*)

- Cluster options:
- American Studies = 3 courses in film studies (ENG 306U)
  - Popular Culture = 3 courses in film studies (ENG 306U)
  - Freedom/Privacy/Technology = 3 courses in ethics (PHL)
  - Leadership for Change<sup>♦</sup> = 3 courses in leadership/civic engagement (PA, CR)

#### **Senior Capstone: 6 credits** (*choose one theme*)

- Capstone options:  Multimedia Production (6 cr. any term – fully online)

*Additional options in Salem:*

- Homeless and Disadvantaged Populations<sup>♦</sup> (6 cr. summer or 2 cr. fall/winter/spring)
- Role of the Museum in the Community<sup>♦</sup> (3 cr. winter and 3 cr. spring)

#### **PSU Residency Requirement: 45 of last 60 credits must be taken at PSU**
